10. *Monona Terrace Community and Convention Center opens its doors and the 59-year-old vision becomes a reality. 1997*

7. *Metzner's bill is repealed. Wright dies at age 91 in AZ hospital four days after stomach surgery. 1959*

1. *Wright is commissioned by a group of residents led by electrical contractor for the State Capitol, Paul Harloff. The "Olin Terraces" proposal by Wright is massive! It included a marina for 5000 seat auditorium, railroad depot, court rooms, jail cells with lake views and parking for 4,500 cars. There were two giant waterfalls from rooftop to lake. The County Board of Supervisors turns it down, losing thousands of dollars in federal grant money. 1938*

8. *Wright's successor firm, Taliesin Architects, presents several ideas for a public auditorium and lakeshore development. None of them go anywhere. 1960's-1970's*

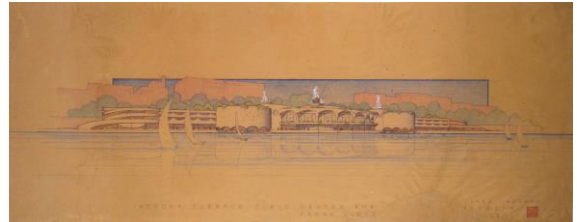
5. *Lead adversary Carroll Metzner, local lawyer and common council member. He pushes a bill through State Legislature banning construction of any lakeshore building in Law Park over 20ft. high. 1957*

3. *The project moves forward and the design changes substantially through this period to meet the needs of the city. First, Wright proposes a sprawling auditorium with a drive and several rings of parking that reached far into Lake*

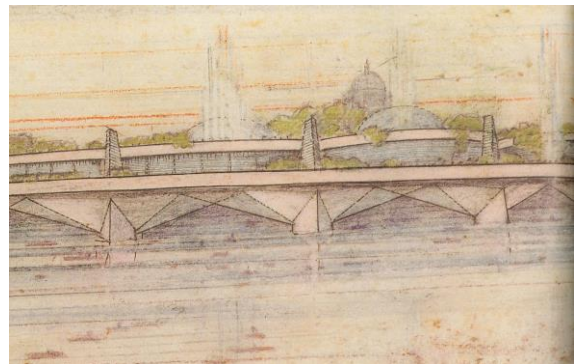
Monona. Then, upon the city's request, he reduced the project in size and scale- Wright didn't like it and referred to the small design as a "peanut". 1954-1957

9. *Madison Mayor Paul Soglin, in office for 2nd term, rallies for Monona Terrace Project. Tony Puttnam, Wright's closest apprentice on the project while he was alive, is selected as project architect, said Wright 59 plan could be used for today's purposes; same exterior and modified interior. Voters approve project by narrow margin. 1990's*
